# Local Nature Recovery Strategy


### Background

Cheshire West and Chester Council asked to lead the development of a Local Nature Recovery Strategy for Cheshire, on behalf of Warrington, Cheshire East, Peak District National Park, working with Natural England, Environment Agency, Forestry Commission, the Local Nature Partnership and other organisations.

## What is an LNRS -

Local Nature Recovery Strategies (LNRS) are a flagship measure in the Environment Bill. They are a new system of spatial strategies for nature which will plan, map, and help drive more coordinated, practical, focussed action and investment in nature's recovery to build the national Nature Recovery Network.

Broadly these will be created for each County across England

## **The Initial Consultation includes**

- A questionnaire to find out what matters to you and what you think needs doing
- A chance to pledge what action you are going to take as an individual, group, landowner etc
- If you are a landowner, the opportunity to register land where you may be interested in attracting funding to help with nature's recovery (for us to consider including your land in priority mapping for nature's recovery and signpost you to organisations and funders that could help with Biodiversity Net Gain, Agri-Environment, Trees for Climate and other suitable grants sources)



# Summary Process – part 2 (next stage)








Ratify priority list (county, sub areas)
