
NEW FARMING RULES TO CUT POLLUTION & SUPPORT FARMERS

New, clearer farming rules proposed will help to improve water quality, reduce pollution in rivers and give farmers the confidence to grow food sustainably.

Proposals include tighter controls on spreading sewage sludge on farmland, including options to bring it under the Environmental Permitting Regulations and simplifying existing agricultural water rules.

This simplified, clearer regulatory approach will sit alongside support through Environmental Land Management schemes, the Catchment Sensitive Farming advice programme and targeted infrastructure grants, helping farm businesses reduce pollution, protect water and strengthen their long-term resilience. LOCAL NATURE RECOVERY IN CHESHIRE

In Cheshire, over 400 farmers have pledged 30,000 hectares for nature recovery through the Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS).

The strategy helps address biodiversity loss, flood risk, soil degradation, and water scarcity by enabling farmer-led solutions, including the Weaver-Gowy blended finance model that pays for wetland restoration to improve water availability, reduce flooding, and support resilient farming.

The process also created the farmer-led Future Farmers Group and the Hedgerow Recovery Scheme to restore hedgerows and wildflower margins for better soil health, yields, and wildlife.

- There will be a review of payment rates for actions that take land out of production where uptake has been particularly high.

There will be 2 application windows

June

- Those with small farms
- Those without existing environmental land management agreements

September

- All farmers
